TONE 3

Ven. Simeon of Emessa, Fool-for-Christ, and his fellow ascetic, Ven. John

"Lord I Call..." Tone 3

Lord, I call upon Thee, <u>hear</u> me. Hear <u>me</u>, O Lord. Lord, I call upon Thee, <u>hear</u> me. Receive the <u>voice</u> of my prayer, when I <u>call</u> upon Thee.// <u>Hear me</u>, O Lord.

Let my <u>prayer</u> arise in Thy sight as <u>incense</u>, and let the lifting <u>up</u> of my hands be an evening <u>sac</u>rifice.// <u>Hear me</u>, O Lord.

V. (10) *Bring my soul out of prison, that I may give thanks to Thy Name.*

Tone 3 *(for the Resurrection)*

By Thy Cross, O Christ our <u>Sav</u>ior, death's dominion has been <u>shat</u>tered; the devil's de<u>lu</u>sion destroyed. The race of man, being <u>saved</u> by faith,//always <u>offers Thee</u> a song.

V. (9) The righteous will surround me, for Thou wilt deal bountifully with me.

All has been enlightened by Thy Resur<u>rec</u>tion, O Lord. Paradise has been <u>opened</u> again. All creation, <u>prais</u>ing Thee,// always <u>of</u>fers <u>Thee</u> a song.

V. (8) Out of the depths I cry to Thee, O Lord. Lord, hear my voice!

I glorify the power of the <u>Fa</u>ther and the Son. I praise the authority of the Holy <u>Spi</u>rit: the undivided, uncreated <u>God</u>head,// the consubstantial Trinity which <u>reigns</u> for<u>ever</u>.

V. (7) Let Thine ears be attentive to the voice of my supplications!

(Resurrection stichera by Anatolius)

We bow down in worship before Thy precious <u>Cross</u>, O Christ, and we glorify and praise Thy Resur<u>rec</u>tion,// for by Thy <u>wounds</u> we have <u>all</u> been healed.

V. (6) *If Thou, O Lord, shouldst mark iniquities, Lord, who could stand? But there is forgiveness with Thee.*

Tone 4 (for Sts. Simeon and John) (Thou hast given a sign)

Dwelling in the desert in unity of mind, O <u>bless</u>ed ones, you caused the unrest of the flesh to <u>with</u>er away by <u>fast</u>ing, prayer, and enlightening contem<u>plation</u>. You illumined your hearts with the pleasing gifts of the <u>Spir</u>it,//O Simeon and John, the confirmation of mo<u>nas</u>tics.

V. (5) For Thy Name's sake I wait for Thee, O Lord. My soul has waited for Thy word; my soul has hoped on the Lord.

With foolish behavior thou didst render foolish the malice of the wise, O blessed <u>Fa</u>ther,

performing wondrous signs, working miracles, and expelling <u>de</u>mons, en<u>light</u>ening those who dwell in the <u>dark</u>ness of sin.

In the midst of turmoil thou didst preserve <u>cla</u>rity of mind// and didst receive dispassion from God, O <u>Sim</u>eon.

V. (4) From the morning watch until night, from the morning watch, let Israel hope on the Lord!

O divinely in<u>spired</u> one, thou wast shown to be humble in wisdom and <u>mer</u>ciful, com<u>passionate</u> and full of <u>love</u> for God.

Humble and meek, thou didst walk the earth like an <u>angel</u>, living thy life as <u>if</u> in <u>heaven</u>.

Therefore, because of thy purity, O blessed <u>Simeon</u>,// the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit rested in thee as in a place of <u>pur</u>ity.

V. (3) For with the Lord there is mercy and with Him is plenteous redemption, and He will deliver Israel from all his iniquities.

Tone 8 (for Prophet Ezekiel) (Oh, most glorious wonder)

O <u>won</u>drous E<u>ze</u>kiel, most wise and <u>blessed</u> by God, having cleansed thy <u>soul</u> and <u>body</u>, thou didst behold in the spirit through a <u>purified</u> mind the ineffable, unsearchable <u>glory</u> of the Lord, praised in hymns by in<u>nu</u>merable <u>voices</u>,// and borne aloft with lightning flashes by divine <u>Ser</u>aphim.

V. (2) Praise the Lord, all nations! Praise Him, all peoples!

O Ezekiel, dwelling <u>place</u> of God, thou wast sorely tried in emu<u>la</u>tion of Christ.

Thou didst bear the cruel burden of a <u>debt</u> to <u>a</u>liens.

Thou didst desire that this be recorded beforehand for the <u>sake</u> of the Cross, the God-revealed deliverance and sal<u>va</u>tion of the world.//

Pray that all who celebrate thy memory today may be granted a <u>share</u> in it!

V. (1) For His mercy is confirmed on us, and the truth of the Lord endures forever.

O <u>glor</u>ious Ezekiel, in<u>spired</u> by God, thou didst receive a scroll, sweeter than honey in thy mouth from the Al<u>mighty</u> and wast given <u>know</u>ledge in <u>things</u> divine.

Beholding and <u>con</u>templating God, thou wast a herald of holy <u>mys</u>teries,// offering the resentful assembly com<u>passion</u> from God.

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit;

now and ever, and unto ages of ages. Amen.

Tone 3 (*Theotokion – Dogmatikon*)

How can we not wonder at thy mystical childbearing, O exalted Mother? For without receiving the touch of man, thou gavest birth to a Son in the flesh, O immaculate Virgin. The Son born of the Father before eternity was born of thee at the fullness of time, O honored Lady. He underwent no mingling, no change, no division, but preserved the fullness of each nature. Entreat Him, O Lady and Virgin and Mother, to save the souls of those who, in the Orthodox manner, confess thee//to be the Theotokos.

Aposticha

Tone 3 *(for the Resurrection)*

The sun was darkened by Thy <u>Pas</u>sion, O Christ, but all creation was enlightened by the light of Thy Resur<u>rec</u>tion.// Accept our evening <u>song</u>, O <u>Lover</u> of man!

V. *The Lord is King; He is robed in majesty!*

Thy life-bearing Resur<u>rec</u>tion, O Lord, enlightened the whole universe, recalling Thy cre<u>a</u>tion. Delivered from Adam's <u>curse</u>, we sing://
O Almighty <u>Lord</u>, <u>glory</u> to Thee!

V. For He has established the world, so that it shall never be moved.

Thou art the <u>change</u>less God,
Who, suffering in the <u>flesh</u>, wast changed.
Creation could not endure seeing <u>Thee</u> on the Cross.
It was filled with fear while praising Thy <u>pa</u>tience.
By descending to hell and rising on the <u>third</u> day,//
Thou hast granted to the world <u>life</u> and great <u>mercy</u>.

V. Holiness befits Thy house, O Lord, forevermore!

Thou didst endure <u>death</u>, O Christ, to deliver the race of <u>men</u> from death.

Thou didst rise from the dead on the <u>third</u> day, raising with Thyself those who <u>knew</u> Thee as God// and enlightening the world. Glory to Thee!

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit; now and ever, and unto ages of ages. Amen.

Tone 3 (*Theotokion*)

By the will of the <u>Fa</u>ther, without seed, of the Holy Spirit thou didst conceive the <u>Son</u> of God. He was born of the Father before eternity without a <u>mother</u>, but now for our sake He didst come from thee without a <u>fa</u>ther!// Do not cease entreating Him to de<u>liver</u> our <u>souls</u> from harm!

(at Great Vespers)

Tone 3 Troparion (*Resurrection*)

Let the heavens rejoice!
Let the earth be glad!
For the Lord has shown strength with His arm.
He has trampled down death by death.
He has become the first born of the dead.
He has delivered us from the depths of hell, and has granted to the world//
great mercy.

Tone 4 Troparion (Sts. Simeon and John)

O God of our <u>Fa</u>thers, always act with <u>kind</u>ness towards us; take not Thy <u>mer</u>cy from us, but guide our <u>lives</u> in peace// through the prayers of Venerable <u>Sim</u>eon and John!

now and ever, and unto ages of ages. Amen.

Tone 4 Resurrectional Dismissal Theotokion

The mystery of all eternity, unknown even by Angels, through thee, O Theotokos, is revealed to those on earth: God incarnate by union without confusion. He voluntarily accepted the Cross for us, by which He resurrected the first-created man,//saving our souls from death.

(at Vigil)

Tone 4 Troparion to the Theotokos

Rejoice, O Virgin Theo<u>to</u>kos,
Mary, full of grace, the <u>Lord</u> is with thee!
Blessed art thou among <u>wo</u>men,
and blessed is the <u>Fruit</u> of thy womb,//
for thou hast borne the <u>Sav</u>ior of our souls. (*thrice*)

(at the Divine Liturgy)

Tone 3 Troparion (Resurrection)

Let the heavens rejoice!
Let the <u>earth</u> be glad!
For the Lord has shown <u>strength</u> with His arm.
He has trampled down <u>death</u> by death.
He has become the <u>first</u> born of the dead.
He has delivered us from the <u>depths</u> of hell, and has <u>grant</u>ed to the world//
<u>great mercy</u>.

Tone 4 Troparion (Sts. Simeon and John)

O God of our <u>Fa</u>thers, always act with <u>kind</u>ness towards us; take not Thy <u>mer</u>cy from us, but guide our <u>lives</u> in peace// through the prayers of Venerable <u>Sim</u>eon and John!

Tone 2 Troparion (Prophet Ezekiel)

We <u>cel</u>ebrate the <u>mem</u>ory of Thy prophet E<u>zek</u>iel, O Lord; through <u>him</u> we be<u>seech</u> Thee:// "Save our souls!"

Tone 3 Kontakion (*Resurrection*)

On this day Thou didst rise from the tomb, O <u>Mer</u>ciful One, leading us from the <u>gates</u> of death.
On this day Adam exults as Eve rejoices; with the Prophets and <u>Pa</u>triarchs// they unceasingly praise the divine <u>majesty</u> of Thy <u>power</u>.

Tone 2 Kontakion (Sts. Simeon and John)

Let us <u>praise</u> the venerable <u>Simeon</u> as an equal to the <u>angels</u>, for he <u>walked</u> in the flesh upon the earth as a bodiless <u>angel</u> shining forth to all as an example of the <u>vir</u>tues; and with <u>him</u> let us honor his com<u>panion</u>, the ever memorable and God-bearing <u>Fa</u>ther John,// for they ceaselessly pray to the Lord for us with faith and love!

Tone 4 Kontakion (*Prophet Ezekiel*)

Thou hast been revealed as a Prophet of God, wondrous Ezekiel, proclaiming to all the incarnation of the Lord, the Lamb and Creator,//the Son of God, Who has ever revealed Himself.

Tone 3 Prokeimenon (*Resurrection*)

Sing praises to our God, sing praises! / Sing praises to our King, sing praises! (*Ps.* 46:6)

V. Clap your hands, all peoples! Shout to God with loud songs of joy! (Ps. 46:1)
