Dormition of the Righteous Anna, Mother of the Most Holy Theotokos

"Lord I Call..." Tone 4

Lord, I call upon Thee, <u>hear</u> me! <u>Hear</u> me, O Lord! <u>Lord</u>, I call upon Thee, <u>hear</u> me! Receive the <u>voice</u> of my prayer, when I <u>call upon</u> Thee!// Hear me, O Lord!

Let my <u>prayer</u> arise in Thy sight as <u>incense</u>, and <u>let</u> the lifting <u>up</u> of my hands be an evening <u>sac</u>rifice!// <u>Hear me</u>, O Lord!

V. (6) *If Thou, O Lord, shouldst mark iniquities, Lord, who could stand? But there is forgiveness with Thee.*

Tone 4 (for St. Anna) (Thou hast given a sign)

Thou didst faithfully ob<u>serve</u> the Law and didst work unceasingly for God the Creator. He <u>grant</u>ed thee motherhood, O <u>An</u>na. Thy child brought forth <u>Christ</u> in the flesh. With the Virgin <u>Mother we hon</u>or thee,// and celebrate today thy holy dor<u>mi</u>tion.

V. (5) For Thy Name's sake I wait for Thee, O Lord. My soul has waited for Thy word; my soul has hoped on the Lord.

O divinely-wise Anna, thou gavest birth to the bearer of Life.

Thou didst present thy pure child to a life with God.

Together with the heavenly hosts, thou dost rejoice in the riches from on high.

We commemorate thy falling asleep,// and on this day we honor the Divine Wisdom in faith.

V. (4) From the morning watch until night, from the morning watch, let Israel hope on the Lord!

Having divine wisdom, thou gavest birth to the Door of <u>Heaven</u>, and thou didst achieve heavenly glory for<u>ever</u>. We <u>cel</u>ebrate thy holy dormition, O <u>Anna</u>, and ask thee to pray that the turmoil of passions not de<u>stroy</u> us,// and that we be spared from fear and deso<u>lation</u>.

V. (3) For with the Lord there is mercy and with Him is plenteous redemption, and He will deliver Israel from all his iniquities.

Tone 1 (for St. Anna) (Oh, the Marvelous Wonder)

Be<u>hold</u>, a bright festival and a radiant day bringing <u>joy</u> to the world, the holy and praiseworthy falling asleep of Anna of <u>great</u> fame, from <u>whom</u> was born the <u>bear</u>er of Life, the living Ark who contained the uncontainable Word, the release from despondency, the <u>cause</u> of joy,// who bestows great mercy upon all the <u>faithful</u>.

V. (2) Praise the Lord, all nations! Praise Him, all peoples!

O marvelous wonder!

The noble Anna, who did wondrously bear the <u>source</u> of life, the only <u>pure</u> one, blessed among <u>wo</u>men, passes over from perishable <u>life</u> to <u>life</u> without end.

Taken from <u>earth</u> to heaven, she rejoices today with the <u>Ang</u>els.// It is her holy festival that we now <u>cel</u>ebrate.

V. **(1)** For His mercy is confirmed on us, and the truth of the Lord endures forever.

To<u>day</u> we faithful devoutly celebrate in the Divine <u>Spir</u>it a radiant festival at thy falling asleep, O worthy <u>An</u>na, for thou art <u>pre</u>sent to us, blazing with graces of <u>healings</u>, burning up wicked companies of un<u>worldly spir</u>its // and guiding to the light the minds of those who faithfully praise thine augúst trans<u>la</u>tion.

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit; now and ever, and unto ages of ages. Amen.

Tone 8 (for St. Anna, by Anatolius)

The blameless <u>pair</u>, from whose <u>fruit</u>less loins sprang forth the holy branch, the Theo<u>to</u>kos, from whom the salvation that is Christ our <u>God</u> dawns up<u>on</u> the world—the holy couple, Joachim and <u>Anna</u>—have now been translated to the heavenly <u>dwellings</u>, with their own daughter, the <u>most</u> pure <u>Virgin</u>, and they celebrate with the Angels, as they inter<u>cede</u> for the world. We also come together and devoutly sing their praise, <u>say</u>ing: "You who have become the <u>Fore</u>bear<u>ers</u> of Christ, through the child of God and all-pure <u>Mary</u>,// intercede on be<u>half</u> of our souls!"

Aposticha

Tone 5 (for St. Anna) (Rejoice)

Rejoice, spiritual swallow:

Thou didst announce the spring-time of grace to us!
Thou didst live well and blamelessly in chastity,
preserving the treasure of virginity.
Thou didst give birth with the pangs of a mother
to the all-pure Theotokos who alone knew not a man.
Thou art the honored ewe-lamb who gavest birth to the heifer,
who, at the Angel's word, bore the Word,
the Lamb who takes away the sin of the world,
and has translated thee from the earth, O Anna, Grandmother of the Lord!//
Pray to Him now that He will grant great mercy to our souls!

V. Rejoice in the Lord, O you righteous; praise befits the just! (Ps. 32:1)

Rejoice, O honored pair, beloved of God!
You were chosen for the radiance of your holiness, and by divine grace you beautifully changed the meaning of the Law, for you gave birth to the Lady who gave birth to Christ, the Author of our life.
O Joachim, inspired by God, and Anna, inspired too and all-venerable:
You are lamps raising up the unfading light, for you budded forth the grace that is the blameless Theotokos.
With her beseech our God // that He grant our souls great mercy.

V. Blessed are all those who fear the Lord, who walk in His ways. (Ps. 127:1)

Rejoice, O blessèd earth that didst bud forth in the world the divine shoot, for thou didst unceasingly practice the Law of God as an art, and didst <u>ratify grace</u> for all.

O <u>An</u>na divinely blest, Grandmother of <u>Christ</u> our God, thou didst escape the chains of barrenness by thy <u>child</u>bearing, for thou didst <u>bear</u> the Theotokos, the lamp that <u>bore</u> the Light. With <u>her</u> be<u>seech</u> our God//

that He grant our <u>souls</u> great <u>mer</u>cy.

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit;

now and ever, and unto ages of ages. Amen.

Tone 8 *(for St. Anna)*

Come together, all creation!

Let us praise the divinely-wise Anna on <u>cym</u>bals and with psalms!

Through her womb she gave birth to the divine mountain.

Today she is translated to the spiritual mountain and the mansions of <u>Par</u>adise. Let us cry <u>out</u> to her:

"Blessed is thy womb, which bore her who carried the <u>Light</u> of the <u>world</u> in her womb!

Entreat Him that He may deliver us from all tribulation and assaults of the Enemy//

and that He may save our souls!"

(at Vespers)

Tone 4 Troparion (St. Anna)

Divinely-wise Anna,

thou didst carry in thy womb the pure Mother of God who gave <u>life</u> to our Life. Therefore, thou art now carried joyfully to the inheritance of <u>heav</u>en, to the abode of those who rejoice in <u>glo</u>ry,//

where thou dost seek forgiveness of sins for those who faithfully honor thee, O ever-<u>bless</u>ed one.

We <u>cel</u>ebrate the memory of the progenitors of Christ, and with faith we <u>ask</u> their help, that de<u>liv</u>erance from every affliction be granted to <u>those</u> who cry out:// "Be with us, O <u>God</u>, Who in Thy good pleasure <u>glo</u>rified them!"

Tone 8 Prokeimenon (of the day, for the Apostles)

Their proclamation has gone out into all the earth, / and their words to the ends of the universe. (*Ps. 18:4*)

V. The heavens are telling the glory of God, and the firmament proclaims His handiwork. (Ps. 18:1)

Tone 4 Prokeimenon (St. Anna)

God is wonderful in His saints, / the God of Israel. (Ps. 67:35a)
