Holy and Glorious Greatmartyr Demetrius the Myrrhgusher of Thessalonica Commemoration of the Great Earthquake at Constantinople in 740 A.D.

"Lord I Call..." Tone 2

Lord, I call upon Thee, <u>hear</u> me! Hear <u>me</u>, O Lord! <u>Lord</u>, I call upon Thee, <u>hear</u> me! Receive the <u>voice</u> of my prayer, when I <u>call</u> upon Thee!// Hear me, O Lord!

Let my <u>prayer</u> arise in Thy sight as <u>incense</u>, and <u>let</u> the lifting <u>up</u> of my hands be an evening <u>sac</u>rifice!// <u>Hear me</u>, O Lord!

V. (8) Out of the depths I cry to Thee, O Lord. Lord, hear my voice!

Tone 2 (for St. Demetrius) (Joseph of Arimathea)

Glorious Martyr De<u>me</u>trius, thou dost ever enlighten thy native land like a <u>ra</u>diant star, pro<u>tecting</u> it from destruction by the <u>enemy</u>, delivering it from misery and <u>every</u> storm.

Therefore, O blessed one, it offers thee <u>praise</u> with joy, <u>keeping</u> thine annual commemor<u>ation</u>,// singing hymns with faith and love to the Lord Who has glorified thee.

V. (7) Let Thine ears be attentive to the voice of my supplications!

(Repeat: "Glorious Martyr Demetrius...")

V. (6) *If Thou, O Lord, shouldst mark iniquities, Lord, who could stand? But there is forgiveness with Thee.*

Holy Demetrius, martyr and passion-<u>bear</u>er of Christ, thou dost enlighten the world, like a sun, with <u>mir</u>acles. <u>There</u>fore on the day of thy mem<u>o</u>rial,

we all delight in thy wonders, O <u>bless</u>ed one, as we keep the <u>feast</u> with faith.

Since <u>thou</u> hast boldness be<u>fore</u> the Lord,//
entreat Him to save thy servants from corruption and tribu<u>la</u>tions!

V. (5) For Thy Name's sake I wait for Thee, O Lord. My soul has waited for Thy word; my soul has hoped on the Lord.

Thy side was pierced by spears for the sake of the <u>Sav</u>ior, Whose side was <u>pierced</u> on the Cross, for with <u>love</u> thou didst imitate <u>Him</u> in thy wounds, showing to all the steadfastness of thy witness, O passion-bearer De<u>me</u>trius. Therefore the tyrant fell <u>wounded</u>,// receiving the shaft of thy confession, O <u>ath</u>lete of Christ.

V. (4) From the morning watch until night, from the morning watch, let Israel hope on the Lord!

Tone 8 (for St. Demetrius) (Oh, most glorious wonder)

Oh, most glorious wonder!

Today joy shines forth in <u>heav</u>en and on earth at the commemoration of the <u>mar</u>tyr De<u>me</u>trius.

He is crowned with praises by the Angels and receives <u>songs</u> from men.

How greatly he <u>suf</u>fered!

How well he fought the fight!//

Through him the evil enemy has fallen, and Christ has <u>conquered</u>.

V. (3) For with the Lord there is mercy and with Him is plenteous redemption, and He will deliver Israel from all his iniquities.

(Repeat: "Oh, most glorious wonder...")

V. (2) Praise the Lord, all nations! Praise Him, all peoples!

Oh, most <u>glo</u>rious <u>won</u>der!
With rays of miracles <u>bright</u>er than the sun
Demetrius ever en<u>light</u>ens the <u>ends</u> of the earth,
for he is illumined by the never-<u>fad</u>ing Light
and delights in the Sun that <u>nev</u>er sets.
By his rays the clouds of the <u>enemy</u> have <u>been</u> dispelled,//

infirmities driven away, and the demons <u>van</u>quished.

V. (1) For His mercy is confirmed on us, and the truth of the Lord endures forever.

Oh, most <u>glorious won</u>der!
The thrice-blessed Demetrius, pierced for the <u>sake</u> of Christ, ever reveals himself to the <u>foe</u> as a <u>two</u>-edged sword, cutting down the uprisings of the <u>enemy</u> and casting down the boldness of <u>demons</u>.
Let <u>us</u> cry <u>out</u> to him://
"Holy Demetrius, save us that ever faithfully <u>hon</u>or thee with love!"

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit;

Tone 6 *(for St. Demetrius, by Byzantius)*

Today the universal feast of the passion-bearer has assembled us.

Come, O lovers of the feasts of the Church,
let us brilliantly celebrate his commemoration, saying:

"Rejoice, for thou hast torn the garment of impiety with faith,
robing thyself with a spirit of courage!

Rejoice, for thou hast destroyed the schemes of the enemy with the power given
thee by God!

Rejoice, for with thy pierced limbs
thou hast spiritually portrayed the sufferings of Christ for us!

Entreat Him, O Demetrius, adornment of athletes,
that we be delivered from enemies, visible and invisible,//
and that our souls may be saved!"

Tone 8 (*Theotokion – Dogmatikon*)

The <u>King</u> of heaven, because of His <u>love</u> for man, appeared on earth and <u>dwelt</u> with men. He took <u>flesh</u> from the pure <u>Virgin</u> and after assuming it, He came <u>forth</u> from her. The Son is one: in two natures, yet one <u>Per</u>son. Proclaiming Him as perfect <u>God</u> and <u>per</u>fect Man, we confess <u>Christ</u> our God!//
Entreat Him, O unwedded Mother, to have <u>mer</u>cy on our souls.

Having courageously put down the as<u>saults</u> of the <u>de</u>mons,
he <u>en</u>tered the <u>sta</u>dium with zeal
and gloriously carried off the trophies of <u>vic</u>tory.//
He entreats the Savior that our <u>souls</u> may be saved.

Tone 2 (by Germanus)

O wise martyr Demetrius, God has blamelessly set thy soul in the <u>dwellings</u> on high, for thou be<u>camest</u> a champion of the <u>Trinity</u>, and firm as a rock, thou didst compete bravely in the <u>sta</u>dium. Pierced in thy pure side, O most <u>hon</u>ored One, thou didst <u>imitate</u> Him Who was <u>pierced</u> on the Tree for the salvation of <u>all</u> the world.

Thou hast received the gift of working <u>mir</u>acles, <u>rich</u>ly granting <u>heal</u>ings to all.

Therefore as we fittingly celebrate thy <u>fall</u>ing asleep,//we glorify God Who has <u>glor</u>ified thee.

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit;

Tone 5 (for St. Demetrius) (Let us sound the trumpet)

Let us <u>run</u> with <u>faith</u> and love and cry out with <u>hymns</u> of the feast!

Let us all <u>clap</u> our hands for the celebration of our chief and <u>leader!</u>

Let the <u>armies of Heaven rejoice</u> over him who was pierced for the <u>King</u> and Lord,

Who Him<u>self</u> was pierced with a spear, boldly casting down the daring of the enemy!

Let the earth and sea marvel

at the most glorious signs wrought by this brilliant light!

Let the young fittingly praise the trainer of youth,

the <u>staff</u> of old age, the intercessor in the midst of misfortunes,

the enricher of the poor, the guide on the way,

an <u>al</u>ly in <u>bat</u>tle!

Let us <u>sound</u> the <u>trumpet</u> of joy!

The Queen of heaven inclines her ear to us.

She <u>crowns</u> with blessings those who <u>hon</u>or her.

Let kings and princes run together!

Let them clap their hands to hymns in <u>hon</u>or of the Queen

who gave <u>birth</u> to the <u>King</u> of all!

He ap<u>peared</u> on earth to burst the bonds of those con<u>demned</u> to death.

Pastors and teachers glorify the Mother of the Good **Shep**herd.

<u>She</u> is the golden lampstand and the <u>cloud</u> of light.

Her <u>womb</u> is more spacious than the <u>heav</u>ens.

She is the living temple and the cherubic throne of the <u>Mas</u>ter,

the jar of manna and the sealed gate of the word,

the divine <u>pal</u>ace and the refuge of all <u>Chris</u>tians. Let us bless her with inspired song, be<u>seeching her:</u> "Make us worthless <u>peo</u>ple worthy of the Kingdom of <u>Heaven</u>,// for through thy mediation <u>all</u> things are <u>pos</u>sible!"

Tone 2 (for the Earthquake, by Simeon of the Wonderful Mountain)

When the earth was thrown into confusion at the <u>fear</u> of Thy wrath, the hills and the mountains were made to <u>trem</u>ble, O Lord, but Thou didst <u>look</u> upon us with eyes of com<u>passion</u>. In Thine anger be not en<u>raged</u> with us, but have compassion for the creation that was <u>fash</u>ioned by Thy hands, and de<u>liv</u>er us from the terrible threat of <u>earth</u>quake,// for Thou art good and the <u>Lov</u>er of man!

V. He looks on the earth and makes it tremble. (Ps. 103:34a)

Tone 6

Awesome art Thou, O Lord, and who shall withstand Thy <u>just</u> wrath? Or who shall supplicate or entreat Thee, O <u>Good</u> One, on behalf of the sinful and despairing <u>people</u>? The heavenly ranks of Angels, Principalities and <u>Powers</u>, Thrones, Dominions, the Cherubim and the Seraphim cry out to <u>Thee</u> on our behalf:

"Holy, Holy are <u>Thou</u>, O Lord; disregard not the works of Thy hands, O <u>Good</u> One;// through Thy compassionate mercy, save the people who are in <u>danger!</u>"

V. Thou hast caused the earth to quake and hast troubled it. (Ps. 59:2a)

The Ninevites, because of their trans<u>gres</u>sions, heard that they would be submerged through the threat of <u>earth</u>quake; but by the mediating sign of the whale, repentance summoned resurrection through <u>Jo</u>nah.

Thus, as Thou didst take pity upon Thy people with the children and flocks and hast accepted them,

spare us who are in <u>danger</u>,// and have mercy of on us through Thy Resurrection on the <u>third</u> day!

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit;

Tone 8 *(for St. Demetrius, by Anatolius)*

O glorious Demetrius,

thy most divine and blameless soul has as its dwelling place the heavenly Je<u>ru</u>salem,

whose walls are adorned by the undefiled <u>hands</u> of the in<u>vis</u>ible God, while on earth this glorious temple holds thine all-honored and most victorious <u>bo</u>dy,

a treasury of wonders that cannot be <u>plun</u>dered, a remedy for diseases.

We hasten to it and obtain <u>heal</u>ings.

O all-praiseworthy Martyr,

as thou hast boldness towards <u>Christ</u>, Who has <u>glo</u>rified thee,// guard the city that magnifies thee from the assaults of the <u>ad</u>versaries!

O unwedded <u>Virgin</u>, who ineffably didst conceive <u>God</u> in the flesh, O <u>Moth</u>er of <u>God</u> most high, accept the cries of thy servants, O <u>blame</u>less one! Grant cleansing of trans<u>gres</u>sions to all!// Receive our prayers and pray to <u>save</u> our souls!

(at Great Vespers)

Tone 3 Troparion (St. Demetrius)

The world has <u>found</u> thee to be a great defense against tribu<u>la</u>tion and a vanquisher of heathens, O Passion-<u>bear</u>er.

As thou didst <u>bol</u>ster the courage of <u>Nes</u>tor, who then humbled the arrogance of Lyaios in <u>bat</u>tle,//
Holy Demetrius, entreat Christ God to <u>grant</u> us great <u>mer</u>cy!

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit,

now and ever, and unto ages of ages. Amen.

Tone 3 Troparion (St. Demetrius)

The world has <u>found</u> thee to be a great defense against tribu<u>la</u>tion and a vanquisher of heathens, O Passion-<u>bear</u>er. As thou didst <u>bol</u>ster the courage of <u>Nes</u>tor, who then humbled the arrogance of Lyaios in <u>bat</u>tle,// Holy Demetrius, entreat Christ God to <u>grant</u> us great <u>mer</u>cy! (twice)

Tone 4 Troparion to the Theotokos

Rejoice, O Virgin Theo<u>to</u>kos, Mary, full of grace, the <u>Lord</u> is with thee! Blessed art thou among <u>wo</u>men, and blessed is the <u>Fruit</u> of thy womb,// for thou hast borne the Savior of our souls. (once)

Deliver us all from upheavals, and from terrible afflictions caused by our <u>sins</u>, O Lord,

and spare Thy people whom Thou hast purchased with Thy blood, O <u>Mas</u>ter! Do not deliver Thy city to destruction by terrible <u>earthquakes</u>, for we know no other <u>God</u> but Thee; and to those who cry <u>out</u> Thou dost respond://
"I am with you, and no one will be against you."

Tone 6 Prokeimenon (Earthquake)

O Lord, save Thy people, / and bless Thine inheritance! (Ps. 27:9a)

V. To Thee, O Lord, will I call. O my God, be not silent to me! (Ps. 27:1a)

Tone 7 Prokeimenon (St. Demetrius)

The righteous shall rejoice in the Lord, / and shall hope in Him. (Ps. 63:11a)
