Martyrs Acepsimas the Bishop, Joseph the Presbyter, and Aithalas the Deacon, of Persia

Dedication of the Church of the Greatmartyr George in Lydda

"Lord I Call..." Tone 2

Lord, I call upon Thee, <u>hear</u> me! Hear <u>me</u>, O Lord! <u>Lord</u>, I call upon Thee, <u>hear</u> me! Receive the <u>voice</u> of my prayer, when I <u>call</u> upon Thee!// Hear me, O Lord!

Let my <u>prayer</u> arise in Thy sight as <u>incense</u>, and <u>let</u> the lifting <u>up</u> of my hands be an evening <u>sac</u>rifice!// <u>Hear me</u>, O Lord!

V. (10) *Bring my soul out of prison, that I may give thanks to Thy Name.*

Tone 2 (for the Resurrection)

Come, let us worship the <u>Word</u> of God begotten of the Father before all <u>ages</u>, and in<u>car</u>nate of the Virgin <u>Mary</u>! Having en<u>dured</u> the Cross, He was buried as He Him<u>self</u> desired.// And having risen from the dead, He saved me, an <u>erring</u> man.

V. (9) The righteous will surround me, for Thou wilt deal bountifully with me.

Christ our <u>Sav</u>ior nailed to the Cross the bond against us, He <u>void</u>ed it and destroyed the do<u>min</u>ion of death.// We fall down before His Resurrection on the third day.

V. (8) Out of the depths I cry to Thee, O Lord. Lord, hear my voice! With the Archangels

let us praise the Resur<u>rec</u>tion of Christ! He is our <u>Sav</u>ior, our Re<u>deemer</u>. He is coming with awesome glory and mighty <u>pow</u>er// to judge the <u>world</u> which He made.

V. (7) Let Thine ears be attentive to the voice of my supplications!

(Resurrection stichera by Anatolius)

The Angel pro<u>claimed</u> Thee, the crucified and buried <u>Mas</u>ter.

He <u>told</u> the women: "Come, see the <u>place</u> where He lay! He is <u>risen</u> as He said, for He is al<u>mighty</u>."

We <u>wor</u>ship Thee, O only im<u>mor</u>tal One.//
Have mercy on us, O Christ, the <u>Giv</u>er of life!

V. (6) If Thou, O Lord, shouldst mark iniquities, Lord, who could stand? But there is forgiveness with Thee.

Tone 8 (*for the Martyrs*) (*Oh, most glorious wonder*)

Oh, most <u>glorious won</u>der!
The noble Aképsimas, who ministered to the <u>mar</u>tyrs, today is <u>crowned</u> with a <u>wreath</u> of hymns.
He puts before us the suffering he endured for his <u>wor</u>ship of God and wounds the bodiless <u>Enemy</u>.
What great <u>gifts</u> of <u>grace</u> he received!
Through his prayers, save our <u>souls</u>, O Christ,// since Thou art compassionate!

V. (5) For Thy Name's sake I wait for Thee, O Lord. My soul has waited for Thy word; my soul has hoped on the Lord.

Oh, most <u>glorious wonder!</u>
Joseph shines forth as a star from <u>Per</u>sia.

Through the Spirit he destroyed the <u>out</u>rage of <u>sorcery;</u>
with the streams of his blood he extinguished the impious <u>wor</u>ship of fire.

How great is the strength by which he cast down the <u>de</u>mons!

Through his <u>prayers</u>, save our <u>souls</u>, O Christ,//
since Thou art compassionate!

V. (4) From the morning watch until night, from the morning watch, let Israel hope on the Lord!

Oh, most <u>glo</u>rious <u>won</u>der!
The steadfast Aethalas*, a champion of <u>suffering</u>, is revealed as an ever-<u>blos</u>soming <u>gar</u>den.
Cut down, it brings forth the <u>flo</u>wer of wounds; slain, it then beg<u>ins</u> to live.
How great the strength of his <u>na</u>ture, through <u>which</u> he endured! Through his prayers, save our <u>souls</u>, O Christ,// since Thou art compassionate!

V. (3) For with the Lord there is mercy and with Him is plenteous redemption, and He will deliver Israel from all his iniquities.

Tone 4 (for St. George) (As one valiant among the martyrs)

O passion-bearer George, converser with the <u>Ang</u>els, dweller with the <u>mar</u>tyrs, thou art the <u>ref</u>uge of the <u>sor</u>rowful.

Be a haven of tranquility for me who dost <u>sail</u> through life, and pilot my <u>life</u>, I im<u>plore</u> thee,// that with unwavering faith I may bless thy supernatural <u>struggles</u>.

V. (2) Praise the Lord, all nations! Praise Him, all peoples!

Protect me as I <u>sail</u> upon the sea, as I set out upon the way, and as I <u>sleep</u> at night. When I am a<u>wake</u>, illumine my <u>mind</u>, O George, and instruct me to do the <u>will</u> of God, that on the day of Judgment I may find re<u>mission of</u> the sins that I have com<u>mit</u>ted in my life,// by fleeing to thy protection, O <u>glorious</u> one!

V. (1) For His mercy is confirmed on us, and the truth of the Lord endures forever.

Clothed in the <u>breast</u>plate of faith, armed with the shield of grace and the <u>spear</u> of the Cross, <u>thou</u>, O George, wast invincible to the <u>ad</u>versary. As a divine warrior thou didst conquer legions of <u>de</u>mons. Now thou holdest <u>chor</u>us with the <u>Ang</u>els,// and, entreated by the faithful, thou dost sanctify and <u>save</u> them.

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit;

Tone 6 (from the Menaion, for St. George)

As a tiller of the earth thou didst deserve thy name[†], O <u>war</u>rior George. By carrying on thy shoulders the <u>Cross</u> of Christ, thou hast plowed the earth, barren through <u>Sa</u>tan's snares. The thorns of idolatry <u>held</u> it fast, but thou didst plant it with the vine of true <u>faith</u> in Christ. Thou hast brought healing for the faithful in <u>every</u> land, and hast tended well the garden of the <u>Trin</u>ity. Pray for the well-<u>be</u>ing of the world// and the sal<u>va</u>tion of our souls!

Tone 2 (*Theotokion – Dogmatikon*)

The shadow of the Law passed when grace came; as the Bush burned, yet was not consumed, so the <u>Virgin</u> gave birth, yet remained a <u>Virgin</u>. The Righteous Sun has risen instead of a <u>pillar</u> of flame.// Instead of Moses, Christ, the Sal<u>va</u>tion of our souls.

Tone 2 (for the Resurrection)

Thy Resurrection, O Christ our <u>Sav</u>ior, has enlightened the whole <u>universe</u>, re<u>calling Thy creation.//</u> Glory to Thee, O al<u>mighty Lord!</u>

V. *The Lord is King; He is robed in majesty!*

By the Tree Thou didst destroy the curse of the Tree, O <u>Savior</u>. By Thy burial Thou didst mortify the <u>majesty</u> of death. Thou hast en<u>light</u>ened our race by Thy Resur<u>rec</u>tion.// O Giver of life, Christ our God, <u>glo</u>ry to Thee!

V. For He has established the world, so that it shall never be moved.

When Thou wast seen nailed to the <u>Cross</u>, O Christ,
Thou didst restore the beauty of Thy <u>crea</u>tures.
The <u>sol</u>diers showed their inhumanity when they pierced Thy <u>side</u> with a spear.
The Hebrews, not knowing Thy <u>power</u>,
asked that Thy <u>tomb</u> might be sealed,
but through the <u>mer</u>cy of Thy com<u>passion</u>,
Thou didst ac<u>cept</u> the tomb
and didst rise on the <u>third</u> day!//
O Lord, <u>glory</u> to Thee!

V. Holiness befits Thy house, O Lord, forevermore!

O Christ, the <u>Giv</u>er of life, for the sake of the dead Thou didst voluntarily en<u>dure</u> death, de<u>scending</u> into hell as the <u>Mighty</u> One to save those who awaited Thy <u>coming</u>, granting them the life of paradise in<u>stead</u> of hell. Grant <u>al</u>so to us who glorify Thy Resurrection on the <u>third</u> day// cleansing of our sins and great <u>mer</u>cy!

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit;

Tone 6 *(for the Martyrs, by Ephraim of Karyes)*

The three children, preserved unharmed by the <u>Per</u>sian fire, mystically foreshadowed your thrice-radiant unity of mind and your <u>mar</u>tyrdom in Christ.

O athletes of the ineffable Trinity and supernatural <u>U</u>nity, as they stood in the midst of the flames and did not cry out against God, so also you did not refuse to die when your lives were not spared by the <u>love</u> of Christ.

As in their midst, a fourth appeared who <u>sprin</u>kled them with dew, so also Christ, one of the <u>Trin</u>ity, received you into a place of re<u>fresh</u>ment.

Tone 6 (*Theotokion*)

My Maker and Redeemer, <u>Christ</u> the Lord, was born of thee, O most pure <u>Virgin</u>. By accepting my nature, He freed Adam from his <u>ancient</u> curse. Unceasingly we magnify thee as the <u>Mother of God!</u> Rejoice, O celestial Joy! Rejoice, O <u>Lady</u>://
the Protection, Intercession and Salvation of our souls!

Tone 4 Troparion to the Theotokos

Rejoice, O Virgin Theotokos,
Mary, full of grace, the <u>Lord</u> is with thee!
Blessed art thou among <u>wo</u>men,
and blessed is the <u>Fruit</u> of thy womb,//
for thou hast borne the <u>Sav</u>ior of our souls. (thrice)
(at the Divine Liturgy)

Tone 2 Troparion (Resurrection)

Tone 2 Kontakion (*Martyrs*)

Thou didst <u>cel</u>ebrate the mysteries blamelessly, O <u>wise</u> one, and became thyself an acceptable sacrifice, O divinely <u>bless</u>ed one.

Thou didst <u>glo</u>riously drink of the cup of Christ, Holy A<u>kep</u>simas.//

Together with thy fellow sufferers thou art praying unceasingly to <u>Christ God</u> for us all.

Tone 8 Kontakion (St. George)

As we the faithful <u>flee</u> to <u>thee</u> for refuge and seek thy protection and <u>speedy</u> help,

We entreat thee, O <u>Champion of Christ</u>, that we who sing thy praises may be delivered from the snares of the <u>en</u>emy

and from <u>every peril</u> and <u>adversary,//</u> that we may <u>cry</u>: "Rejoice, O <u>mar</u>tyr George!"

Tone 2 Prokeimenon (Resurrection)

The Lord is my strength and my song; / He has become my salvation. (Ps. 117:14)

V. The Lord has chastened me sorely, but He has not given me over to death. (Ps. 117:18)
