TONE 8

25th Sunday after Pentecost (13th of Luke) Sunday of the Holy Forefathers [Hieromartyr Eleutherius, Bishop of Illyria] (sung whenever the Superior wishes)

"Lord I Call..." Tone 8

Lord, I call upon Thee, hear me! Hear me, O Lord!
Lord, I call upon Thee, hear me!
Receive the voice of my prayer, when I call upon Thee!//
Hear me, O Lord!

Let my <u>prayer</u> arise in Thy sight as <u>incense</u>, and let the lifting <u>up</u> of <u>my</u> hands be an evening <u>sac</u>rifice!// Hear me, O Lord!

V. (10) *Bring my soul out of prison, that I may give thanks to Thy Name.*

Tone 8 *(for the Resurrection)*

We <u>offer</u> to <u>Thee</u>, O Christ, our evening song and reasonable <u>ser</u>vice, for Thou didst <u>will</u> to have <u>mer</u>cy on us// by Thy Resur<u>rec</u>tion.

V. (9) The righteous will surround me, for Thou wilt deal bountifully with me.

Lord, Lord, do not cast us a<u>way</u> from Thy face! For Thou didst will to have <u>mer</u>cy on us// by Thy Resur<u>rec</u>tion.

V. (8) Out of the depths I cry to Thee, O Lord. Lord, hear my voice!

Rejoice, O holy Zion: Mother of the churches, the a<u>bode</u> of God, for thou wast the first to re<u>ceive</u> re<u>mis</u>sion of sins// by the Resur<u>rec</u>tion.

V. (7) Let Thine ears be attentive to the voice of my supplications!

(Resurrection stichera by Anatolius)

The <u>Word</u> of God the <u>Fa</u>ther, begotten before the <u>ages</u>, in the latter times willed to be in<u>car</u>nate of the <u>Virgin</u> and endured cruci<u>fi</u>xion unto death. He has <u>saved</u> mortal man// by His Resurrection.

V. (6) *If Thou, O Lord, shouldst mark iniquities, Lord, who could stand? But there is forgiveness with Thee.*

We glorify Thee, O Lord, for Thou didst voluntarily endure the Cross for our sake. We fall down in worship before Thee, O almighty Savior. Do not cast us away from Thy face but hear us and save us, O Lover of man,//by Thy Resurrection!

V. (5) For Thy Name's sake I wait for Thee, O Lord. My soul has waited for Thy word; my soul has hoped on the Lord.

<u>Glo</u>ry to Thee, O <u>Sav</u>ior Christ, Only-begotten Son of God, who wast <u>nailed</u> to the Cross// and resurrected from the tomb on the <u>third</u> day!

V. (4) From the morning watch until night, from the morning watch, let Israel hope on the Lord!

Tone 8 *(for the Forefathers) (The Paradise of Eden)*

To<u>day</u>, as we celebrate the Forefathers' <u>mem</u>ory, let us the faithful praise Christ the Re<u>deemer</u>, Who magnified them in <u>all</u> the <u>na</u>tions! He is the Lord Who does <u>won</u>drous deeds, for He is powerful and <u>mighty!</u> Through them He has <u>shown</u> us the <u>rod</u> of His strength: she is Mary, the only pure and Virgin <u>Maid</u>en of God. From her Christ <u>blos</u>somed,// bringing forth life, eternal salvation, and unending bliss for all.

V. (3) For with the Lord there is mercy and with Him is plenteous redemption, and He will deliver Israel from all his iniquities.

O <u>Mas</u>ter, Thou didst deliver the holy <u>Youths</u> from the fire, and Daniel from the mouths of <u>li</u>ons;
Thou didst bless Abraham, Isaac, Thy <u>ser</u>vant, and <u>Ja</u>cob, his son;
Thou didst consent to become like us by being <u>born</u> of their seed, to be crucified and <u>bur</u>ied, in order to save our <u>Fore</u>fathers, who <u>fell</u> of old.
Thus Thou didst crush the <u>bonds</u> of death, raising with Thyself all the dead of <u>ages</u> past,// who worship Thee, O Christ, King of the ages.

V. (2) Praise the Lord, all nations! Praise Him, all peoples!

<u>Walking</u> amidst the flames as in a gentle <u>shower</u> of rain, the godly Youths exulted in the dew of the <u>Spirit</u>. By this they mystically prefigured the Trinity and <u>Christ's</u> incar<u>na</u>tion. Wise through faith, they quenched the <u>power</u> of fire. So also the righteous Daniel stopped the mouths of <u>li</u>ons. Through their intercessions we beseech Thee, O <u>Savior</u> and <u>Lover</u> of man: Deliver us from the unquenchable and e<u>ter</u>nal fire,// and make us worthy of Thy heavenly <u>King</u>dom!

V. (1) For His mercy is confirmed on us, and the truth of the Lord endures forever.

Standing in a furnace of flaming fire as though in dew, the Holy Youths mystically prefigured Thy coming from a Virgin, by which we are illumined but not consumed. So also the righteous Daniel, glorious among the Prophets, clearly revealed Thy divine Second Coming when he cried out: "I saw thrones set up, and the Judge was seated, and the river of fire flowed before Him."//
By their intercessions save us from this fire, O Christ our Master!

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit;

Tone 6 *(for the Forefathers, by Anatolius)*

Today, let us the <u>faithful</u> acclaim all the Fathers be<u>fore</u> the Law: Abraham, the <u>friend</u> of God, Isaac, born of the <u>promise</u>,

Jacob and the twelve <u>Pa</u>triarchs, honoring with these the gentle <u>Da</u>vid, and Daniel, the <u>Prophet</u> of Desires, and the three Youths who changed the <u>fur</u>nace into dew. Let us ask forgiveness of <u>Christ</u> our God,// Who is <u>glo</u>rified in His saints!

now and ever, and unto ages of ages. Amen.

Tone 8 (*Theotokion – Dogmatikon*)

The <u>King</u> of heaven, because of His <u>love</u> for man, appeared on earth and <u>dwelt</u> with men.

He took <u>flesh</u> from the pure <u>Virgin</u> and after assuming it, He came <u>forth</u> from her.

The Son is one: in two natures, yet one <u>Per</u>son.

Proclaiming Him as perfect <u>God</u> and <u>per</u>fect Man, we confess <u>Christ</u> our God!//
Entreat Him, O unwedded Mother, to have mercy on our souls.

Litya

(If the rector desires the Litya, following the sticheron to the Patron Saint of the Temple, these stichera are sung)

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit;

Tone 1 *(for the Forefathers)*

En<u>light</u>ened by the rays of divine <u>ut</u>terance, the Prophets, distinguished in name, are called blessed for<u>ev</u>er.

With the <u>words</u> of the Spirit, they proclaimed to all the birth of <u>Christ</u> God, which in <u>words</u> is inex<u>pressible</u>.//

And having lawfully completed their end, they live the life that is most wondrous.

now and ever, and unto ages of ages. Amen.

Tone 1 (Theotokion)

Be<u>hold</u>, Isaiah's <u>proph</u>ecy is fulfilled, for the Virgin gave birth, yet remained a <u>Virgin!</u>

God was born, and so nature was restored anew. Do not despise the entreaties of thy servants, O Mother of God! We offer them to thee in thy temple. Since thou hast carried in thine arms the compassionate One, have compassion on thy servants,// and pray that our souls may be saved.

Aposticha

Tone 8 *(for the Resurrection)*

De<u>scending</u> from heaven to a<u>scend</u> the Cross, the eternal Life has <u>come</u> for death to raise <u>those</u> who are <u>fal</u>len; to enlighten those in <u>dark</u>ness.//
O Jesus, our Savior and illuminator, <u>glory</u> to Thee!

V. The Lord is King; He is robed in majesty!

We <u>glo</u>rify Christ, who <u>rose</u> from the dead. He accepted the human <u>body</u> and soul, and freed <u>both</u> from <u>suffering</u>. His most pure soul descended to <u>Hades</u>, which He spoiled. His holy body did not see cor<u>rup</u>tion in the tomb.// He is the Redeemer of our souls.

V. For He has established the world, so that it shall never be moved.

In <u>psalms</u> and songs we glorify Thy Resurrection from the <u>dead</u>, O Christ. By it, Thou hast freed us from the <u>tor</u>tures of Hades// and as God hast granted eternal life and great <u>mer</u>cy.

V. Holiness befits Thy house, O Lord, forevermore!

O <u>Mas</u>ter of all, incomprehensible Creator of <u>heaven</u> and earth, by Thy suffering on the Cross Thou hast gained <u>pas</u>sionlessness for me. Accepting burial and a<u>rising</u> in <u>glory</u>, Thou didst resurrect Adam with Thyself by Thine al<u>mighty</u> hand. Glory to Thy rising on the <u>third</u> day! By it Thou hast granted us eternal <u>life</u> and <u>cleansing</u> of sins// as the only compassionate One.

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit;

Tone 3 *(for the Forefathers, by Germanus)*

Come all who <u>love</u> the feast, let us praise in psalms the assembly of the <u>Forefathers</u>: Adam, our first <u>Father</u>, Enoch, Noah, Mel<u>chizedek</u>, Abraham, Isaac and <u>Jacob</u>; and those who came <u>after</u> the Law: Moses, Aaron, <u>Joshua</u>, Samuel and <u>David</u>, Isaiah, Jeremiah, Ezekiel and <u>Daniel</u>, and with them the Twelve <u>Prophets</u>: Elijah, Elisha, and <u>all</u> the rest, Zachariah and John the <u>Baptist</u>: all those who pro<u>claimed</u> Christ,// the Life and Resur<u>rec</u>tion of the <u>human race!</u>

now and ever, and unto ages of ages. Amen.

Tone 3 (Theotokion)

By the will of the <u>Fa</u>ther, without seed, of the Holy Spirit thou didst conceive the <u>Son</u> of God. He was born of the Father before eternity without a <u>mother</u>, but now for our sake He didst come from thee without a <u>fa</u>ther!// Do not cease entreating Him to de<u>liver</u> our <u>souls</u> from harm!

(at Great Vespers)

Tone 8 Troparion (Resurrection)

Thou didst des<u>cend</u> from on <u>high</u>, O <u>Mer</u>ciful One! Thou didst ac<u>cept</u> the <u>three</u> day burial to free us from our <u>sufferings!//</u> O Lord, our Life and Resurrection, glory to Thee!

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit, now and ever, and unto ages of ages. Amen.

Tone 2 Troparion (*Forefathers*)

Through <u>faith</u> Thou didst justify the <u>Forefathers</u>, betrothing through them the Church of the <u>gen</u>tiles. These <u>saints</u> exult in <u>glo</u>ry, for from their seed came forth a <u>glo</u>rious fruit: <u>she</u> who bore Thee with<u>out</u> seed.//
So by their prayers, O Christ God, have mercy on us!

(at Vigil)

Tone 4 Troparion to the Theotokos

Rejoice, O Virgin Theo<u>to</u>kos,
Mary, full of grace, the <u>Lord</u> is with thee!
Blessed art thou among <u>wo</u>men,
and blessed is the <u>Fruit</u> of thy womb,//
for thou hast borne the Savior of our souls. (twice)

Tone 2 Troparion (*Forefathers*)

Through <u>faith</u> Thou didst justify the <u>Forefathers</u>, betrothing through them the Church of the <u>gen</u>tiles.

These <u>saints</u> exult in <u>glory</u>, for from their seed came forth a <u>glo</u>rious fruit: <u>she</u> who bore Thee with<u>out</u> seed.//
So by their prayers, O <u>Christ</u> God, have <u>mercy</u> on us! (once)

(at the Divine Liturgy)

Tone 8 Troparion (Resurrection)

Thou didst des<u>cend</u> from on <u>high</u>, O <u>Mer</u>ciful One! Thou didst ac<u>cept</u> the <u>three</u> day burial to free us from our <u>suf</u>ferings!// O Lord, our <u>Life</u> and Resur<u>rec</u>tion, <u>glo</u>ry to Thee!

Tone 2 Troparion (Forefathers)

Through <u>faith</u> Thou didst justify the <u>Fore</u>fathers, betrothing through them the Church of the <u>gen</u>tiles. These <u>saints</u> exult in <u>glory</u>,

for from their seed came forth a <u>glo</u>rious fruit: <u>she</u> who bore Thee with<u>out</u> seed.// So by their prayers, O Christ God, have mercy on us!

Tone 6 Kontakion (Forefathers)

You did not worship the graven <u>image</u>,
O thrice-<u>bless</u>ed ones,
but armed with the immaterial <u>Es</u>sence of God,
you were glorified in a <u>trial</u> by fire.
From the midst of unbearable flames you called on God, <u>cry</u>ing:
"Hasten, O com<u>pas</u>sionate One!
Speedily <u>come</u> to our aid,//
for Thou art merciful and able to do as Thou dost will!"

Tone 4 Prokeimenon (Forefathers)

Blessed art Thou, O Lord God of our fathers, / and praised and glorified is Thy Name forever! (Song of the Three Holy Children, v. 3)

V. For Thou art just in all that Thou hast done for us! (v. 4)
