Forefeast of the Nativity of Christ
[Greatmartyr Anastasia, "Deliverer from Bonds"] (sung whenever the Superior wishes)

"Lord I Call..." Tone 1

Lord, I call upon Thee, hear me! Hear me, O Lord!
Lord, I call upon Thee, hear me!
Receive the voice of my prayer, when I call upon Thee!//
Hear me, O Lord!

Let my <u>prayer</u> arise in Thy sight as <u>incense</u>, and <u>let</u> the lifting <u>up</u> of my hands be an <u>eve</u>ning <u>sac</u>rifice!// <u>Hear me</u>, O Lord!

V. (10) *Bring my soul out of prison, that I may give thanks to Thy Name.*

Tone 1 (for the Resurrection)

Ac<u>cept</u> our evening prayers, O <u>ho</u>ly Lord! Grant us re<u>mis</u>sion of sins,// for Thou alone hast manifested the Resur<u>rec</u>tion to the world.

V. (9) The righteous will surround me, for Thou wilt deal bountifully with me.

En<u>cir</u>cle <u>Zi</u>on and surround her, O <u>people!</u>
Give <u>glory</u> in her to the One Who <u>rose</u> from the dead!
For <u>He</u> is <u>our God</u>,//
Who has delivered us from our trans<u>gres</u>sions!

V. (8) Out of the depths I cry to Thee, O Lord. Lord, hear my voice!

Come, O people,

let us hymn and fall <u>down</u> before Christ, <u>glo</u>rifying His Resur<u>rec</u>tion from the dead! For <u>He</u> is <u>our</u> God,//
Who has delivered the world from the <u>En</u>emy's deceit!

V. (7) Let Thine ears be attentive to the voice of my supplications!

(Resurrection stichera by Anatolius)

Be glad, O heavens!
Sound trumpets, O foundations of the earth!
Sing in gladness, O mountains!
Behold Emmanuel has nailed our sins to the Cross!
Granting life, He has slain death.//
He has resurrected Adam as the Lover of man.

V. (6) If Thou, O Lord, shouldst mark iniquities, Lord, who could stand? But there is forgiveness with Thee.

Tone 6 (for the Forefeast) (Having placed all their hope)

The never-setting Sun presses <u>for</u>ward to rise, enlightening all things under <u>heaven</u>.

Let us hasten with clean hands and pure deeds to <u>meet</u> Him; let us prepare to be borne on high with Him in <u>spir</u>it!

Let us beseech Him in His com<u>passion</u>, that, as He comes in His good pleasure to His <u>own</u> strange birth, He may lead us, who have become <u>strangers</u> to the path of life in <u>Eden</u>,// into Bethlehem where He <u>comes</u> to be born!

V. (5) For Thy Name's sake I wait for Thee, O Lord. My soul has waited for Thy word; my soul has hoped on the Lord.

The Word of God, upborne on the shoulders of the cherubim, goes to dwell in a womb without blemish.

Though without passions, He is bound fast to the flesh;
He comes on earth as a man, born of the tribe of Judah.

A cave becomes the palace of the King of all;
the fiery throne is replaced by a manger,
where the Virgin Mary Jays Him as a babe,
for He comes to restore the first-created man,"/
as He is well-pleased so to do.

V. (4) From the morning watch until night, from the morning watch, let Israel hope on the Lord!

O Word of God without beginning, the Virgin lays Thee in a manger of <u>dumb</u> beasts. Thou dost choose to begin Thy <u>life</u> in the flesh in a manner beyond under<u>standing</u>. Thou hast come to loose me from the fetters of <u>evil</u> with which the envious serpent <u>bound</u> me. O Lover of man, Thou art wrapped in <u>swaddling</u> clothes, tearing to pieces the bonds of my <u>countless</u> sins. Therefore I joyfully praise and worship Thy <u>ho</u>ly birth,// for Thou didst come to <u>set</u> me free.

V. (3) For with the Lord there is mercy and with Him is plenteous redemption, and He will deliver Israel from all his iniquities.

Tone 6 (for the Holy Fathers) (Having placed all their hope)

The memory of the Ancestors is revealed to the <u>ends</u> of the world, truly <u>filling</u> it with light and making known the <u>dawning</u> of grace. For Christ shone forth from afar, <u>brighter</u> than the sun, the leading rank of stars <u>shining</u> with Him; and the divine-human birth was revealed to take place in <u>Beth</u>lehem. Therefore with faith let us all <u>gather</u> at this birth,// rejoicing in chorus and singing the pre-<u>fest</u>al praise!

V. (2) Praise the Lord, all nations! Praise Him, all peoples!

Adorned with the glory of divine communion,

Adam rejoices today, as he is the foundation and support of the wise <u>An</u>cestors. With him Abel leaps with joy, and <u>E</u>noch makes glad; Seth dances, and <u>No</u>ah with him; the all-praiseworthy Patriarch <u>A</u>braham sings; Melchizedek beholds from afar the birth that is without a <u>fa</u>ther. Therefore, as we celebrate the divine memory of the <u>Forefathers</u> of Christ,//we pray for the salvation of our souls.

V. (1) For His mercy is confirmed on us, and the truth of the Lord endures forever.

The three Youths, <u>wise</u> in God, who shone with joy in the <u>fur</u>nace, proclaimed the birth of <u>Christ</u> on earth; For just as the Lord sent down a <u>pre</u>cious dew, He preserved from the flame <u>her</u> who gave birth, keeping her undefiled and enriching her with di<u>vine</u> gifts. Therefore Daniel, pleasing to God, rejoiced and was glad, for having foreseen the Stone from the unquarried <u>mountain</u>,//he now prays with boldness in be<u>half</u> of our souls.

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit;

Tone 6 *(for the Holy Fathers)*

Daniel, the man of desires, be<u>held</u> Thee, O Lord, the Stone cut without human hands from the <u>Mountain</u>. Thus, he foretold that Thou wouldst take <u>flesh</u> without seed, O Word of God, born of the <u>Virgin</u>,// the changeless God and <u>Sav</u>ior of our souls!

Tone 6 (for the Forefeast, by Byzantius)

O cave, make ready, for the <u>Ewe</u> Lamb comes, bearing <u>Christ</u> in her womb!

O manger, receive Him Who by a word has released the dwellers of earth from <u>law</u>lessness!

You shepherds, abiding in the fields, bear witness to the fearful wonder, And you magi from Persia, offer to the King gold, myrrh, and <u>frank</u>incense, for the Lord has appeared from a Virgin <u>Mother!</u>
And she, bending over Him as a <u>hand</u>maiden, worshipped Him as He lay in her arms, <u>say</u>ing to Him: "How wast Thou sown as <u>seed</u> in me? How hast Thou grown with<u>in</u> me,//
O my De<u>liv</u>erer and my God?"

make ready, O hearts of righteous men!
Instead of myrrh, bring hymns as an offering of wisdom;
receive salvation and immortality of your souls and bodies!
Behold, the Master lying in the manger
urges us to complete our spiritual songs.
Let us cry out to Him unceasingly,//

V. The Lord is King; He is robed in majesty!

Let creation rejoice!
Let the <u>heavens</u> be glad!
Let the <u>nations</u> clap their hands with <u>gladness</u>, for Christ our Savior has <u>nailed</u> our <u>sins</u> to the Cross. Slaying <u>death</u>, He has given <u>life</u>.//
He has resurrected fallen Adam as the Lover of man.

V. For He has established the world, so that it shall never be moved.

As <u>King</u> of <u>heav</u>en and earth,
Thou wast voluntarily crucified in Thy <u>love</u> for man.
