## SUNDAY, APRIL 21, TONE 5 Fifth Sunday of Great Lent St. Mary of Egypt

#### "Lord I Call..." Tone 5

<u>Lord</u>, I call upon Thee, <u>hear</u> me. • <u>Hear</u> me, O Lord. • <u>Lord</u>, I call upon Thee, <u>hear</u> me. • Receive the <u>voice</u> of my prayer, • when I <u>call</u> upon Thee. • <u>Hear</u> me, O Lord.

<u>Let</u> my <u>prayer</u> arise • in Thy sight as <u>incense</u>, • and <u>let</u> the lifting <u>up</u> of my hands • be an <u>evening sacrifice</u>. • <u>Hear me</u>, O Lord.

#### Tone 5, for the Resurrection

(10) Bring my soul out of prison, that I may give thanks to Thy Name.

By Thy <u>precious Cross</u>, O Christ, • Thou hast put the <u>devil</u> to shame. • By Thy Resur<u>rection</u>, Thou hast blunted the <u>sting</u> of sin • and <u>saved</u> us from the <u>gates</u> of death. • We glorify Thee, O <u>only-begot</u>ten One.

(9) The righteous will surround me, for Thou wilt deal bountifully with me.

<u>Christ</u> was led as a sheep to the <u>slaughter</u> • in order to grant Resurrection to the <u>human race</u>. • The <u>princes</u> of Hades were <u>frightened</u> by this, • for the <u>gates</u> of sorrow were <u>lifted</u>. • Christ the King of glory had <u>entered</u>, • <u>saying</u> to those in <u>chains</u>: "Go forth." • And to those in <u>darkness</u>: "<u>Come</u> to the light."

(8) Out of the depths I cry to Thee, O Lord. Lord, hear my voice.

O great wonder. • The Creator of the invisible suffered in the flesh in His <u>love</u> for man • and <u>rose</u> again immortal. • <u>Come</u>, O sons of <u>nations</u>, • let us <u>wor</u>ship Him, • for de<u>livered</u> from error by His compassion, • we have learned to sing of one <u>God</u> in three <u>Persons</u>.

## Tone 5, Resurrection Stichera by Anatolius

(7) Let Thine ears be attentive to the voice of my supplications.

We <u>offer Thee our evening worship</u>, • O never-<u>setting Light</u>, • Who didst <u>come</u> in these last days to the <u>world</u> in the flesh; • Who <u>even didst descend to Hades to dispel its <u>darkness</u>. • Who hast revealed the light of Resurrection to the <u>nations</u>. • Glory to Thee, O <u>Lord</u> and <u>Giver of light</u>.</u>

(6) If Thou, O Lord, shouldst mark iniquities, Lord, who could stand? But there is forgiveness with Thee.

We <u>glorify</u> the Leader of our sal<u>vation</u>; • by His Resur<u>rec</u>tion from the dead, • the <u>world</u> was <u>saved</u> from deceit. • The as<u>sem</u>bly of Angels rejoices • as the deceit of demons is overthrown. • Fallen Adam rises as the devil falls.

(5) For Thy Name's sake I wait for Thee, O Lord. My soul has waited for Thy word; my soul has hoped on the Lord.

The <u>guards</u> were instructed by the <u>law</u>less ones: • "Hide the rising of Christ, take <u>money</u> and say: • 'The <u>body</u> was stolen from the tomb while <u>we</u> were asleep." • But <u>who</u> has heard of a body being <u>stolen</u>, • a body embalmed and <u>naked</u>, • with its <u>grave</u> clothes left be<u>hind</u> in the tomb? • Do <u>not</u> be deceived, O Jews, • study the words of the Prophets and <u>un</u>derstand: • Christ is the Redeemer of the <u>world</u> and all <u>powerful</u>.

## Tone 6, from the Lenten Triodion, (Having placed all their hope)

(4) F rom the morning watch until night, from the morning watch, let Israel hope on the Lord.

Thou wast standing before the <u>doors</u> of the Church, • polluted with evil and unable to <u>enter</u>. • Accused by thine own conscience, O <u>wise</u> one of God, • thou wast converted to a <u>better</u> way of life. • Looking upon the icon of the blessed <u>Mother</u> of God, • thou didst condemn all thy past sins, O Mother <u>Mary</u>, • and didst go to bow before the <u>pre</u>cious Cross.

(3) For with the Lord there is mercy and with Him is plenteous redemption, and He will deliver Israel from all his iniquities.

REPEAT: Thou wast standing before the <u>doors</u> of the Church, • polluted with evil and unable to <u>en</u>ter. • Accused by thine own conscience, O <u>wise</u> one of God, • thou wast converted to a <u>bet</u>ter way of life. • Looking upon the icon of the blessed <u>Mother</u> of God, • thou didst condemn all thy past sins, O Mother <u>Mary</u>, • and didst go to bow before the <u>pre</u>cious Cross.

(2) Praise the Lord, all nations. Praise Him, all peoples.

Having worshipped at the holy places with <u>great</u> joy, • thou didst receive saving grace for thy journey of <u>vir</u>tue. • Thou didst set out in haste to follow the <u>nar</u>row path, • crossing the river <u>Jor</u>dan, • and going to live where the <u>Bap</u>tist had dwelt. • Through self-denial thou didst tame the savagery of the <u>passions</u>, • and through violence thou didst break the re<u>bel</u>lion of thy flesh, • taking the Kingdom of <u>God</u> by force.

(1) For His mercy is confirmed on us, and the truth of the Lord endures forever.

Thou didst live alone in the <u>wilderness</u>, • and as thou didst erase the images of <u>sin</u> from thy soul, • God marked it with the imprint of <u>ho</u>liness. • Filled with the spirit, O Blessed <u>Mother</u>, • thou didst walk on the surface of the <u>wa</u>ters; • by thy prayers

thou didst ascend from earth to <u>heaven</u>. • Since thou standest before Christ, O glorious <u>Mary</u>, • entreat Him with boldness to <u>save</u> our souls.

#### Tone 4, from the Lenten Triodion

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit;

The power of Thy Cross has worked a <u>won</u>der, O Christ. • Through it a harlot became a champion of the as<u>cet</u>ic life. • She cast a<u>side</u> her weakness and bravely fought the <u>devil</u>, • and having won the prize of <u>vic</u>tory, • she ceaselessly <u>prays</u> for our souls.

### *Tone 5, Theotokion – Dogmatikon*

Both now and ever, and unto ages of ages. Amen.

<u>In</u> the Red <u>Sea</u> of old, • a type of the Virgin Bride was pre<u>fig</u>ured. • There <u>Moses</u> divided the <u>waters</u>; • here <u>Gabriel</u> assisted in the <u>miracle</u>. • There Israel crossed the sea without <u>getting</u> wet, • here the <u>Virgin</u> gave birth to <u>Christ</u> without seed. • After <u>Is</u>rael's passage, the sea remained impassable; • after Emmanuel's birth, the Virgin remained a <u>Virgin</u>. • O <u>ev</u>er-existing God Who didst appear as Man, • O <u>Lord</u>, have <u>mer</u>cy on us.

# Aposticha Tone 5, for the Resurrection

We <u>magnify</u> Thee in <u>songs</u> of praise, • O incarnate Christ and <u>Savior</u>. • By accepting the Cross and <u>death</u> for our sake, • as the <u>Lord</u> and <u>Lover</u> of man, • Thou didst overthrow the <u>gates</u> of Hades, • and didst arise on the <u>third</u> day, <u>saving</u> our souls.

The Lord is King; He is robed in majesty.

By being <u>pierced</u> in the side, O <u>Lover</u> of man, • Thou hast poured out drops of life and sal<u>vation</u> for all. • By ac<u>cepting</u> death in the flesh, Thou hast granted us immor<u>tality</u>. • Thou hast <u>freed</u> us by being <u>placed</u> in the tomb, • and hast resurrected us with Thyself in <u>glory</u>, as God. • Glory to Thee, O <u>Lord</u> and <u>Lover</u> of man.

For He has established the world, so that it shall never be moved.

Thy cruci<u>fix</u>ion and descent into Hades are awesome, O <u>Lov</u>er of man. • Thou hast captured it, releasing the ancient <u>pris</u>oners. • Thou hast <u>opened Paradise</u> and <u>given</u> it to us. • <u>Grant</u> us purification of sins, • who glorify Thy Resurrection on the <u>third</u> day. • Make us <u>wor</u>thy of <u>Paradise</u> • and <u>save</u> us, O <u>Lov</u>er of man.

Holiness befits Thy house, O Lord, forevermore.

For our <u>sake</u>, Thou didst accept <u>death</u> in the flesh, • to rise from the dead on the <u>third</u> day. • <u>Heal</u> us from our earthly <u>passions</u>, • and re<u>store</u> us from our evil transgressions; • and save us, O Lover of man.

### Tone 2, from the Lenten Triodion

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit;

With the sword of <u>ab</u>stinence, • thou didst cut down the corrupt desires of thy soul and the <u>passions</u> of thy flesh. • With the <u>si</u>lence of the wilderness thou didst strangle thy sinful <u>words</u> and thoughts. • Thou didst water the desert with the <u>streams</u> of thy tears, • and madest the fruits of repentance to <u>grow</u> for us. • We celebrate thy memory, O <u>ho</u>ly one.

#### Tone 2. Theotokion

Both now and ever, and unto ages of ages. Amen.

A new miracle surpasses all ancient <u>miracles</u>. • Who knows of a Mother who gave birth with<u>out</u> a man, • who <u>carried</u> in her arms her Creator? • This birth is the <u>will</u> of God. • Since thou didst carry Him as an infant in thine arms, O most <u>pure</u> one, • and since <u>thou</u> dost possess motherly boldness be<u>fore</u> Him, • do not cease praying for us who <u>hon</u>or thee, • that He may be bountiful and <u>save</u> our souls.

## Troparia at Great Vespers Tone 5, Troparion, Resurrection

Let <u>us</u>, the faithful, praise and <u>wor</u>ship the Word, • co-eternal with the Father and the <u>Spirit</u>, • <u>born</u> for our salvation from the <u>Virgin</u>; • for He <u>willed</u> to be lifted up on the <u>Cross</u> in the flesh, • to en<u>dure</u> death, • and to <u>raise</u> the dead • by His <u>glo</u>rious Resurrection.

## Tone 8, Troparion, St. Mary of Egypt

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit.

The image of <u>God</u> was <u>truly</u> preserved in thee, O <u>Mother</u>, • for thou didst take <u>up</u> the <u>Cross</u> and <u>fol</u>low Christ. • By so <u>doing</u>, thou <u>taughtest</u> us to disregard the flesh for it <u>passes</u> away; • but to care in<u>stead</u> for the <u>soul</u>, for it is im<u>mor</u>tal. • Therefore thy <u>spirit</u>, O <u>holy</u> Mother Mary, rejoices with the <u>angels</u>.

#### Tone 8, Resurrectional Dismissal Theotokion

Both now and ever, and unto ages of ages. Amen.

For our sake Thou wast <u>born</u> of <u>the Virgin</u> • and didst en<u>dure crucifix</u>ion, O Good One, destroying <u>death</u> by death. • Revealing the <u>Resurrection</u> as God, do not despise the <u>work</u> of Thy hand. • Reveal Thy <u>love</u> for <u>man</u>, O Merciful One, and accept the Theotokos <u>praying</u> for us, • and save the des<u>pairing people</u>, O our <u>Savior</u>.

# Troparia at Vigil Tone 4, Troparion to the Theotokos

Rejoice, O Virgin Theotokos, • Mary, full of grace, the <u>Lord</u> is with thee. • Blessed art thou among <u>wo</u>men, • and blessed is the <u>Fruit</u> of thy womb, • for thou hast borne the <u>Savior</u> of our souls. *(thrice)* 

# At the Divine Liturgy *Tone 5, Troparion, Resurrection*

Let <u>us</u>, the faithful, praise and <u>wor</u>ship the Word, • co-eternal with the Father and the <u>Spirit</u>, • <u>born</u> for our salvation from the <u>Virgin</u>; • for He <u>willed</u> to be lifted up on the <u>Cross</u> in the flesh, • to en<u>dure</u> death, • and to <u>raise</u> the dead • by His <u>glorious</u> Resurrection.

### Tone 8, Troparion, St. Mary of Egypt

## Tone 3, Kontakion, St. Mary of Egypt

Having <u>been</u> a sinful <u>wo</u>man, • thou becamest through repentance a <u>bride</u> of Christ. • Having attained angelic life, • thou didst defeat demons with the <u>weap</u>on of the Cross. • Therefore, O most glorious Mary, thou art a bride of the Kingdom.

## Tone 5, Prokeimenon, Resurrection

Thou, O Lord, shalt protect us and preserve us from this generation forever. (Psalm 11:7)
