## Venerable and Godbearing Father Anthony the Great

### "Lord I Call..." Tone 4

Thou wast radiant with divine light by the grace of the Holy Spirit,

O Father <u>An</u>thony.

(Repeat: "Thou wast radiant...")

V. (2) Praise the Lord, all nations! Praise Him, all peoples!

O Anthony, pure in <a href="heart">heart</a> and soul, an earthly angel and a <a href="heavenly">heavenly</a> man, a <a href="teacher">teacher</a> of chastity, a clear measure of <a href="abstinence">abstinence</a>; now thou dost live with thy Master, O <a href="blessed">blessed</a> saint. Thou dost offer <a href="him">Him</a> unceasing praise, as do the Angels, all holy monastics, and <a href="martyrs.//">martyrs.//</a> Do thou free from sin and danger those that ever keep thy holy <a href="martyrs">memory!</a>

**V.** (1) For His mercy is confirmed on us, and the truth of the Lord endures forever.

(Repeat: "O Anthony, pure in heart and soul...")

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit;

Tone 6 (by Sykeotes)

Thou didst set thy mind as master over the deadly <u>passions</u>, keeping the image unharmed through the as<u>cet</u>ic life.

Thus thou didst rise into the perfect <u>like</u>ness, for, bravely curbing nature, thou didst hasten to subject to that which is <u>bet</u>ter: and didst make the body servant to the <u>spirit</u>.

Therefore thou wast revealed as the chief of those living the mo<u>nas</u>tic life, a citizen of the <u>des</u>ert, a master teaching those who didst <u>come</u> to thee, a perfect example of <u>vir</u>tue.

Now the shadows have been set aside, O <u>An</u>thony, and in heaven thou beholdest in purity the Holy <u>Trin</u>ity,// as thou dost pray with boldness for those who honor thee with <u>faith</u> and love.

God by nature, yet <u>Man</u> for our sake, not two persons, but one known in two <u>na</u>tures.
Entreat Him, O pure and all-blessed <u>Lady</u>,// to have <u>mer</u>cy on our souls!

Divine and honored ladder leading to <u>heav</u>en,

thy God-pleasing life has been made known to all,

for through it thou didst manifest the fruits of piety.

By it thou healest the weaknesses of the passions of those who cry out to <u>thee</u> with faith:

<sup>&</sup>quot;Rejoice, O most golden star of the east;

torchbearer and shepherd of monastics!
Rejoice, O ever-praised one,
fairest offspring of the wilderness and unshaken support of the Church!
Rejoice, great guide of those who are led astray!//
Rejoice, for thou art our boast and the radiant joy of the inhabited earth!"

Let us honor <u>An</u>thony, an earthly angel and a heavenly <u>man</u> of God, the <u>blame</u>less a<u>dorn</u>ment of the world, the delight of the pious, the boast and glory of <u>those</u> who fast! He was planted in the <u>house</u> of God and <u>flour</u>ished in righteousness like a cedar in the <u>des</u>ert. He increased Christ's flock of <u>ra</u>tional sheep// in holiness and <u>right</u>eousness.

O holy <u>Fa</u>ther, from thy birth thou wast trained in <u>vir</u>tue, be<u>coming</u> an instrument of the Holy <u>Spir</u>it. From God thou didst receive performance of <u>mir</u>acles, and persuaded peoples to despise the <u>pleasures</u> of this life. <u>Now</u>, being illumined with the Di<u>vine</u> Light,// enlighten also our minds, O Father <u>An</u>thony!

# Tone 3 (by Anatolius)

O venerable Anthony, as though at rest among material things, thou didst complete thy fervent and valorous pursuit of ascetic strictness; for, having spiritually joined thyself to the desert places, thou didst trample underfoot the burning, fiery quivers of the demons; and, having gained the upper hand in every virtue, thou dost dwell with the Angels in the Kingdom of Heaven.// Therefore intercede with Christ God for the salvation of our souls!

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit;

#### Tone 5

O <u>ho</u>ly <u>Fa</u>ther, hearing the Lord's voice in the <u>Gos</u>pel, thou didst <u>spurn</u> the riches and <u>glo</u>ry of the world. Thou didst cry out to all: "Love God and find e<u>ter</u>nal grace! Set <u>nothing high</u>er than His love; <u>thus</u>, thou wilt find rest with all the saints, when He comes in <u>glo</u>ry!"// Through his prayers guard and <u>save</u> our <u>souls</u>, O Christ!

Girded with it, thou didst defeat all who reject the divine appearance of <u>Christ</u> in the flesh.//

**V**. Blessed is the man who fears the Lord, who greatly delights in His commandments. (Ps. 111:1)

Strengthened as a shining pillar of virtues,

thou wast an overshadowing cloud,

<u>leading</u> those in the desert from earth to <u>heav</u>en.

Thus, thou wast a seer of God.
